DIDGERIDOOS - ABORIGINAL INSTRUMENTS

The care and storage

If you want to optimize the life of your natural instrument, please follow these tips:

- Swish your didgeridoo twice a year (ideally in spring and fall) with sabo grape seed oil (available in all Coop stores, Switzerland). This impregnates the inside of the wooden instrument and thus protects it better from damaging climatic influences.
- During the winter period, store this natural instrument in a room with relatively high humidity (at least 55% relative humidity). The use of a humidifier based on the evaporation principle is optimal.
- Eucalyptus wood is sensitive to large temperature fluctuations and damage can occur.
- If possible, transport the instrument well packed (carrying bag especially for didgeridoo).
- Avoid leaving the instrument in the sun. Do not leave the didgeridoo outdoors overnight and never leave the instrument in the car on a hot day.
- The transition periods in spring and autumn are particularly delicate, due to room heating. Please never store your instrument on a heated floor or next to a radiator.

Please note: Eucalyptus (tropical wood) is much more sensitive to climate changes than most native woods.
